The Youth Center is open every weekend except holiday weekends. Current advertising and having the board outside has helped attendance. We are looking at offering some competition gaming as a possible draw i.e., pool contests, pinball contests, ping pong contests, and bean bag contests. We would offer concessions as prizes or winners could get in free at their next visit. Once school is open we will again place posters on the bulletin boards announcing the competitions and winners. We are looking for some local talent who might be willing to play guitar or other instruments. It would be like a jamming session so they would not be paid but would have an outlet to practice their music for the neighborhood students and families attending. We are continuing to list the hours and dates in the Community Education Brochure that goes out to all homes in the district. Currently we are doing a "Back to School" supply drive chaired by Lion Steve and Co-chaired by Lion Bonnie. We increased our drop off places this year for the school supplies and donations are up from last year. A complete report will be given at our next meeting as to the value and distribution of the supplies as the drive will conclude Aug. 31<sup>st</sup>. In addition, we will have our annual "Sight Night" collection of used eye glasses campaign during the month of October followed by our annual Halloween Party on Saturday - October 26<sup>th</sup>. We are looking for help in the following categories: decorating, games, prizes, food, costumes, donations, and advertising; to help please call Chairperson Lion Cathy Jo 763-218-7870 or Co-Chairperson Lion Susie at 763-658-4185. Plans include decorating and setting up games from 10 AM to 2PM on Oct. 26<sup>th</sup> followed by lunch provided by Cathy Jo with the party to begin by 4PM and run until 6PM in time for the Youth Center to open again by 6:30 PM. The announcement of the winning costumes will be at 5:15 PM. The age categories for costumes are: 0-4, 5-8, and 9-12. There will be prizes given for  $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$ , and  $3^{rd}$  place in each category. First place will receive \$15, second place will receive \$10, and third place will receive \$5. Our can recycling brought in \$9.46 to help replace pop and water for our concessions. Currently we have \$34.00 in petty cash to replace supplies or concessions as needed.
